Inspire Action — Hearth's Annual Gala October 17, 2024

Each year Hearth holds its annual gala fundraising event and this year our theme was *Inspire Action*. During the gala, we recognize an individual who is committed to ending homelessness and is presented with the "Anna Bissonnette Award", named after one of Hearth's founders.

This year Gordon Wayne, a 23-year -old from Caroline County in rural Central Virginia, was our honoree. As Gordon shared his story, the audience of 150+ sat quietly in awe. At 18 years of age, Gordon found himself alone and homeless, living in his car for shelter. He managed to attend community college days, earning an associate degree with an impressive 4.0 average while working nights and living in his car.

The depression and loneliness, along with the day-to-day struggle to survive, began to take a toll on Gordon. But he did not give up; he persevered, applying to four-year colleges as a transfer student, hoping for a full scholarship. He knew college would provide him with an opportunity for a future and a much needed place to live. Fortunately, Gordon received a full scholarship to Boston College Carroll School of Management.

Grateful for the opportunity and wanting to give back, he committed to walk over 500 miles from rural Virginia to Boston College. He created a GoFundMe page to raise money for the National Alliance to End Homelessness.

After graduating from Boston College, Gordon applied to law school. He was accepted into University of Georgia's School of Law on a full scholarship. Once again, he realized the magnitude of this opportunity and wanted to give back, not wanting to forget those who remain homeless. Gordon committed to walking from Virginia to Georgia, another 500+ mile journey and fundraiser. In total, Gordon raised over \$200,000 for the National Alliance to End Homelessness.

Today, Gordon is in his second year of law school and committed to ending homelessness. When Gordon finished sharing his story at the gala, the audience rose to their feet.

Gordon took action to not only help himself, but to help others. He inspired many on his journey and in his young life. Gordon did not just accept the gifts and opportunities for himself, he thought of others and how he could use his gift to help those in need.

Gordon and his incredible journey, Inspired Action for many that evening, and his young legacy will have a lasting impact on the work we do at Hearth. We are thankful for his commitment to ending homelessness and are forever grateful that he is now part of the Hearth community.









The Impact of Hearth's Work

Hearth Housing Can Improve Life Expectancy for Formerly Homeless Older Adults

Hearth has 228 units of innovative housing options from Permanent Supportive Housing to Assisted Living so older adults can age in place in the community for as long as possible. Did you know the national life expectancy for homeless individuals is 50 years?

At Hearth, formerly homeless residents who passed away did so, on average, at 72.42 years old. This suggests that Hearth's housing and services have significantly extended the lifespan of these individuals by an average of more than 22 years. Furthermore, half of Hearth residents are currently 70 years old and older. We also know that experiencing homelessness advances the aging process. Homeless adults in their 50s have geriatric conditions such as vision

impairment, incontinence, and falls at rates akin to those of housed adults who are 20 years older.

Given the complexity of the aging process for formerly homeless older adults, Hearth's supportive services are customized to the evolving health and social needs of every resident. These valuable services address the social determinants of health, non medical factors impacting health, such as economic and housing stability, access to quality health care, access to healthy food options, and community engagement.

His mandate is to strengthen our existing partnerships and engage new funders to support and diversify our programming. Prior to Hearth, he was the Foundation Relations Officer for

Metro Housing|Boston for the previous five years after escaping the restaurant industry. He is a Tufts University alum, a tortured Phoenix Suns fan, and a cat dad for an 18-year-old ginger nuisance named Monty.

Dylan Curtis is Hearth's Development Associate and resident jack-of-all-trades, presiding over database management, digital and traditional mail fundraising campaigns, content generation, and a host of administrative functions too lengthy to list. Dylan has been working in development for more than eight years, helping to improve fundraising outcomes on a variety of projects for organizations dedicated to building adapted homes for severely injured veterans, lifting low-income families out of poverty, and improving research, facilities, and medical outcomes at Tufts Medical Center. His favorite project was working with the team at Tufts Medical Center to secure funding from the Dunkin' Donuts Foundation for Dottie, a hospital support dog.

We welcome our new members of the development team to the Hearth community and look forward to blazing new paths to innovating our approach to fundraising and community engagement.

Out and About with Hearth's Outreach Department

Hearth's Outreach Department plays a pivotal role in extending a helping hand to those in need, offering a lifeline of support through housing search, stabilization services, and homelessness prevention initiatives.

The Outreach Case Managers schedule weekly visits to Boston area shelters in order to connect with homeless older adults. The team also provides stabilization services to those recently housed. This includes regular check-ins including home visits, to ensure they are transitioning to their new home and accessing services.

When the team is not in the office, you can find them out in the community. A favorite event is Outreach's annual Rise Up luncheon, which was held at Franklin Park on July 18th. This event is to acknowledge the incredible journey outreach and prevention clients have embarked upon. The road to housing and stability is long and challenging. On this day Hearth celebrates the clients who have persevered through some of the most challenging times. It was a day of tears of joy, laughter, and dancing.

On September 14, 2024 the Outreach Department participated in the 3rd Annual Community Resource Fair by New Beginnings Re-Entry Services. The event was located in Grove Hall – Dorchester, MA. The team had an opportunity to engage and collaborate with local leaders, business owners, vendors, and community members.

On October 9, 2024, Dr. LaTanya Wright, Vice President for Outreach and Partnerships along with Gregory Grays-Thomas, LCSW, Bureau Director - Homeless Services Bureau for Boston Public Health Commission were invited to the BU School of Public Health. Dr. Wright and Mr. Grays-Thomas addressed graduate students enrolled in the course: Homelessness, Stories, Solutions, Advocacy taught by Professor Harold Cox, MSSW, a Professor of the Practice at the BU School of Public Health.

As the work of Hearth's Outreach Department continues, it's clear that these efforts are as essential as they are inspiring. Through every shelter visit, every community event, and every story shared with future advocates, the team embodies Hearth's commitment to helping older adults achieve stability and dignity in their later years.

Together, with the support of our community, we can ensure that no older adult faces the prospect of homelessness alone. Your continued generosity fuels our programs, expands our reach, and strengthens the safety net for those who need it most. As we look ahead, we invite you to join us in uplifting and empowering Boston's older adults – so that, one day, every individual can age with a sense of security and peace.

Resident Spotlight: Get to Know Horace

Horace has an infectious smile, an easy-going demeanor, and a positive outlook that is inescapable: "Living here is a wonderful thing," he says, highlighting the community of Hearth residents: "I'm friendly with all my neighbors."

Horace grew up in the South End, attending elementary school at Joseph Hurley, and spent 40 years working for the City of Boston's Department of Public Works, the last eight as a dispatcher. Unfortunately, after retirement, he was only able to afford an apartment in a crime-infested part of Dorchester – "up there where the thugs are," he says with his trademark grin, which then turns serious:

"Just surviving, it was really rough. You open your front door and somebody gets shot right in front of you."

Enough was enough, and he needed to find a way out. He had a bed at Pine Street, but needed a place of his own where he could feel safe. Hearth's Outreach department worked with Horace to help him find stable housing. Fortunately, they were able to find an apartment for him at Hearth's Anna Bissonnette House, where he has been a fixture for the past six years.

Horace loves participating in Hearth's Socialization

and Recreation activities, but he has a particular favorite: "Living here, there's a lot of good things, but the Karaoke thing, I think that's wonderful. The girl they have coming, man, she can sing." Overall, he is very happy with our selection of group activities, but he would like to see computer literacy classes offered for residents, saying, "We need to be in the millennium; we're still living in the 1900s."

Horace's journey from facing daily danger to finding a safe, supportive home at Hearth's Anna Bissonnette House embodies the heart of Hearth's mission. Through the Outreach and Prevention team's dedicated efforts, he found not only a place to live but a vibrant community that brings him joy and peace. His laughter and warmth have become a part of the fabric of Hearth, and his request for new opportunities, like computer literacy classes, reflects the resilience and forward-thinking spirit we strive to foster among all our residents.

For Horace, and so many others, a safe, stable home changes everything. As we look to the future, we remain committed to expanding these opportunities and uplifting all those who, like Horace, are ready for a new chapter. Together, we can ensure more seniors experience the security, community, and joy that a home at Hearth brings.
